Active duty or reserve U.S. Navy Corpsman who is serving, or has served with a U.S. Marine unit. Veteran U.S. Navy Corpsman who has served with a U.S. marine unit and received an honorable discharge, medical discharge, was wounded, or killed while service in the U.S. Navy. Student must be planning to attend an accredited undergraduate college or vocation/technical institution in the upcoming academic year.
